Re: LinkIt and 20-21 Assessment Information

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Next week, all second through eighth grade students will participate in online Language Arts and Mathematics assessments via LinkIt. The language arts assessment will take place on Tuesday, September 29th and the mathematics assessment will take place on Thursday, October 1st beginning at approximately 8:45am. Each teacher will be providing more specific information to their students prior to and on the day of the assessment. Most students are already familiar with these assessments, as LinkIt was administered last school year.

LinkIt assessments allow teachers to easily identify a student's strengths and weaknesses, differentiate instruction, provide tailored interventions, measure student mastery of grade level learning standards, and help teachers determine how to best support your child. This data is also used by the counseling office, special support teachers, and members of our Child Study Team to gain an accurate assessment picture of students. LinkIt data is also utilized to evaluate our programs and adjust our curriculum accordingly. LinkIt results will be shared with parents/guardians at fall conferences. Please keep in mind that this assessment is only one of the multiple measures we use to make instructional decisions.

If your child is learning virtually, it is imperative that you help us provide a secure testing environment by adhering to the following:

- Provide a quiet space with limited interruptions where your child can work independently for about 60 minutes (typical testing time is between 45-55 minutes).
- **Remind your child that he/she is not permitted to search the internet or use other offline resources to help answer questions.**
- **Refrain from coaching and providing assistance of any kind.** Offering assistance will not provide us with accurate results regarding your child's performance and capability. Please just encourage your child to do his/her best.
- Do not allow access to a calculator for Math, except on the Algebra I assessment.

Logistical information related to your child's taking the *LinkIt Assessment at Home*:

- If possible, your child should use the Google Chrome browser. If you don't have it, you can download it for free.
- Your child will log into test.linkit.com. Students can use their student ID number to log-in and teachers will provide the test code.

Besides administering the LinkIt assessment, other assessments will also be administered this school year. As discussed at back-to-school night and pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-6.6, all school districts are required to provide information for state assessments and commercially-developed assessments that will be administered for the school year. Attached is the Netcong School District assessment calendar for the 2020-2021 school year.

Re: Diagnostic Reading Assessment (DRA) Information

Dear Parent/Guardian:

During the month of October, Netcong Elementary School staff will utilize the Diagnostic Reading Assessment (DRA) to assess Kindergarten through fifth grade students' independent reading proficiency and overall literacy skills. An independent level is one at which a child reads with 95-100% accuracy, without assistance. Over time, the DRA shows your child's growth in reading and provides essential data for teachers to use in grouping students for guided reading, developing classroom groups for specific reading skills, providing supplemental support, and continuing to develop the independent reading level of their students. Teachers are able to match students' instructional levels to appropriate texts and provide appropriate but challenging reading instruction.

Please refer to the correlations chart below for DRA levels and their corresponding grade levels:

Grade Level	Fall	Spring
Kindergarten	N/A	3
First Grade	4	16
Second Grade	18	28
Third Grade	30	38
Fourth Grade	40	40
Fifth Grade	50	50

- DRA levels above define exactly what skills and abilities readers should possess at each grade level ("on-grade level" scores)
